How Does It Work?

Category	Eligible Projects	Loan Forgiveness**
Base Program Funding		
Drinking Water Revolving Fund Base (DWRFB)	Broad project eligibility: replacing aging infrastructure, storage, distribution, treatment, upgrades, repairs, new facilities, meters, etc.	<u>Partial loan forgiveness for disadvantaged communities</u>
Water Pollution Control Revolving Fund Base (WPCRF)	Broad project eligibility: replacing aging infrastructure, collection, stormwater, treatment, upgrades, repairs, new facilities, nonpoint source etc.	None
Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) Funding (2022-2026)		
DWRFB Supplemental	Same eligible projects as base program listed above	<u>Partial loan forgiveness for eligible communities</u>
WPCRF Supplemental		
DWRFB Lead Service Line Replacement	Removal of lead service lines including identification, planning and design for associated projects	
DWRFB Emerging Contaminants	Projects addressing emerging contaminants (e.g., PFAS, PFOA, contaminants on EPA's Contaminant Candidate List)	
WPCRF Emerging Contaminants
